Nothing makes his words seem more prophetic than Lady Liberty, with a sign reading "free speech", being blocked by more and more signs: "Except racist speech", "Except homophobic speech", "Except religious speech", "Except anti-religious speech", the image getting steadily more crowded as time progresses. However, this is not only about our precious freedom of speech, but about the perennial struggle to preserve our human rights even when they are threatened by the very people who claim to defend them.
